- 1. White—but they may be decorated with precious metals so be gold or silver, too!
- 2. The altar is now often decorated with flowers, while during Lent it was bare.
- 3. Organ and instrumental music is now allowed, while during Lent it could only be used to support singing.
- 4. If you go to the Easter Vigil Mass, there are often a lot more readings! For the Easter Vigil, up to 7 from the Old Testament plus 1 New Testament reading before the Gospel may be read. For Easter Sunday Mass during the day, there are the usual two readings before the Gospel.
- 5. The Gospel was from Luke for the Easter Vigil; it was from John for Easter Sunday Mass during the day.
- 6. In all the Gospels for the Easter Vigil or Easter Mass during the day, we hear that Jesus' followers found an empty tomb on Easter morning, because Jesus had risen from the dead as He said!
- 7. Often people are baptized on Easter, both babies and adults.
- 8. Did your priest bless water and then use it to baptize anyone?
- 9. Usually the congregation renews their baptismal promises by standing and holding a lighted candle. We all answer, "I do" to the questions we are asked by the priest, then he sprinkles us with blessed water.
