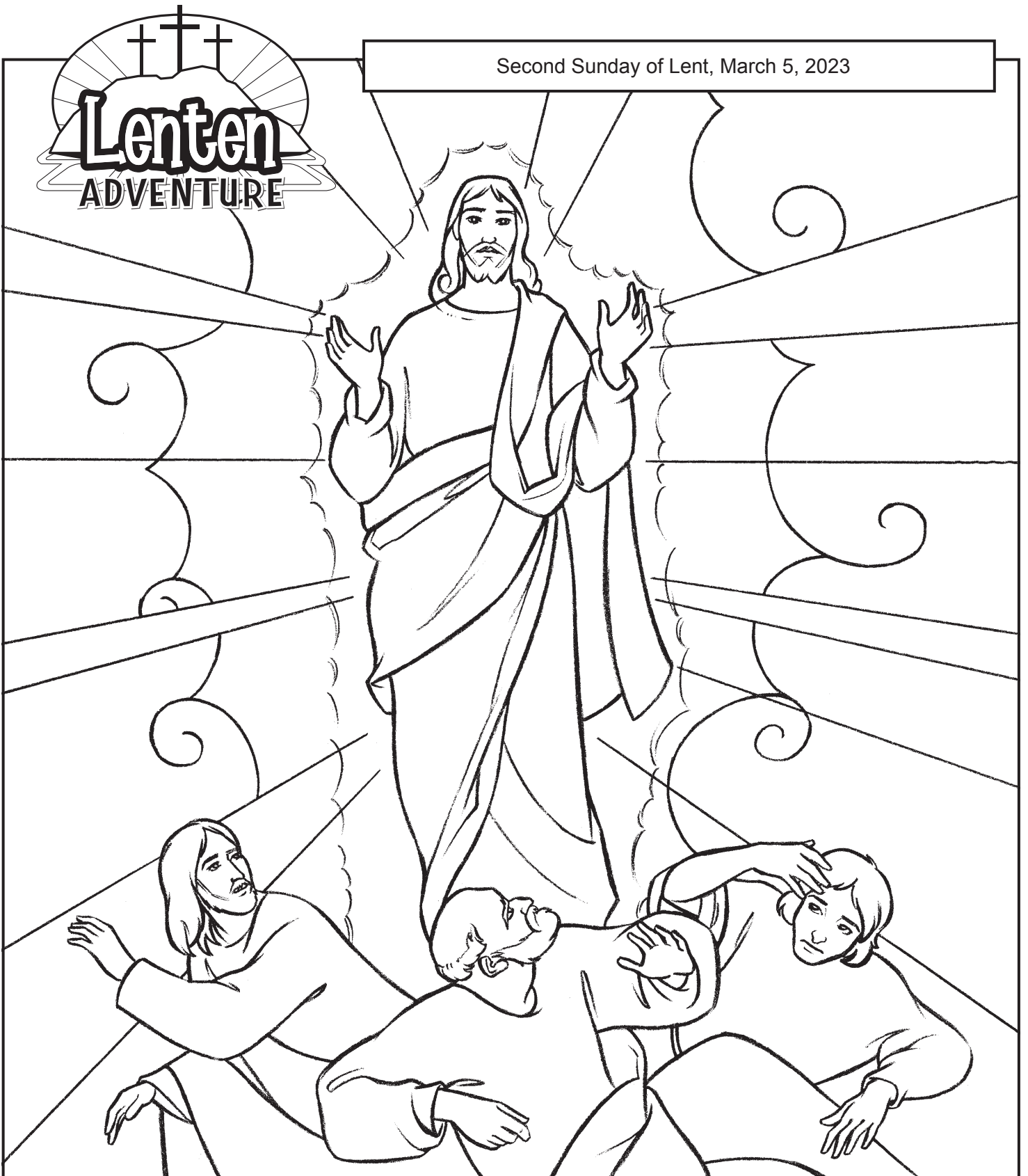


Second Sunday of Lent, March 5, 2023

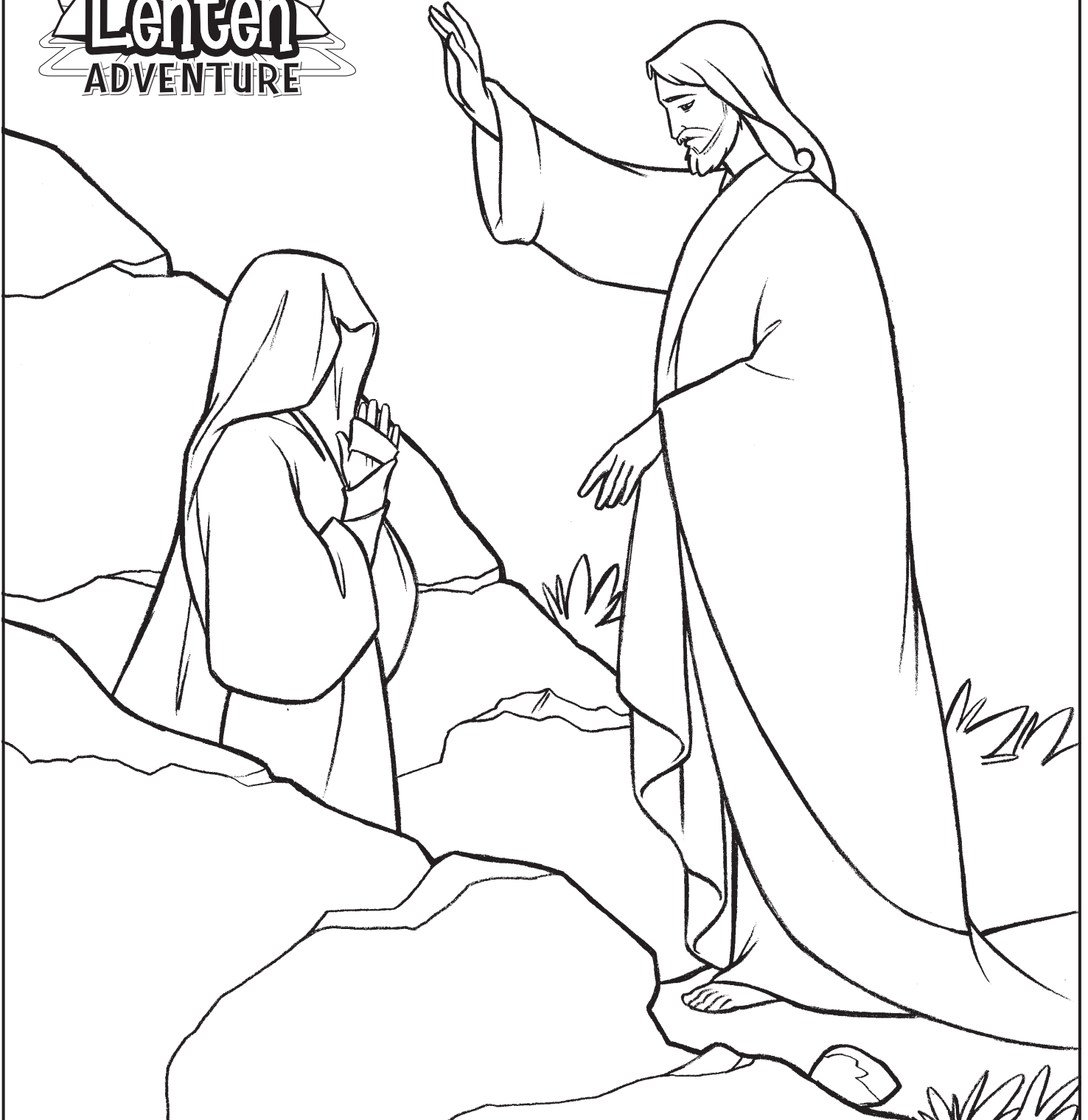
